Keonya, what do you want to be when you grow up? Typically, the traditional college student formally changes his or her major three times before completing graduation. In fact, up to 75% of the freshmen class enters each fall as undeclared or undecided. It is no mystery that the greatest difficulty in life is, "the choice."

As a fail safe beginning, each student must complete the undergraduate core curriculum consisting of 42 semester hours of general education courses regardless of one's major choice. These foundational courses represent the interrelated liberal arts and sciences that provide the basis for a baccalaureate degree program. During this three semester experience, one finds time to explore interests, interact with faculty and sample areas that may lead to a more comfortable decision.

To assist with this challenge, KSU offers a broad support system for first year students to help narrow choices. The CAPS (Counseling, Advising and Program Services) Center is a valuable resource for students who need help with advising, personal and career counseling, and testing. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

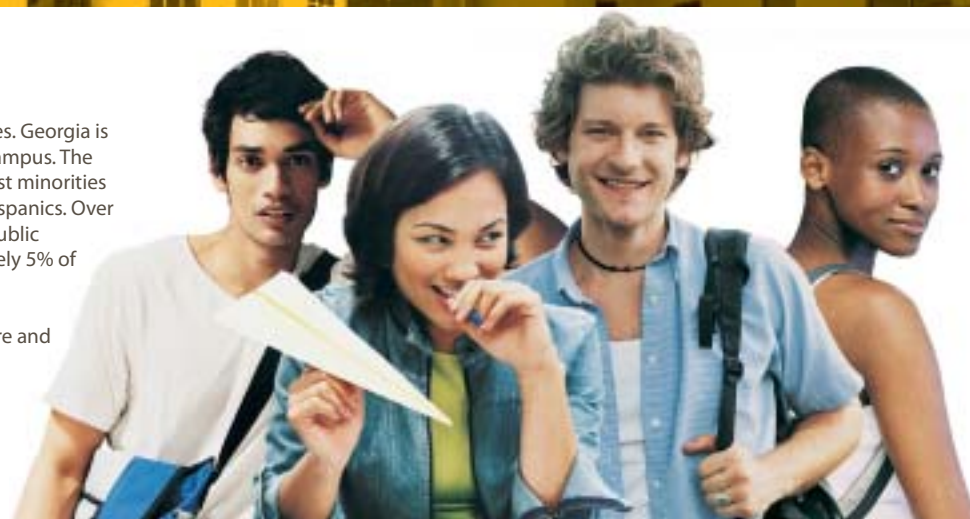

Freshman / Transfer Freshman
Joe, freshmen are those who graduated from high school in the past five years and have earned no college credit or less than 30 semester hours (45 quarter hours).

Minimum requirements include completion of the 16 units of college preparatory curriculum, a 2.5 gpa on the 16 units, 950 total SAT with minimum subparts of 430 verbal and 400 math or 20 ACT composite with minimum subparts of 17 English and 17 math. Graduation from a regionally accredited high school recognized by KSU is required. If you previously attended a college, you must be in good standing. We encourage you to participate in the "First Year Experience" program designed to improve the quality of undergraduate education.

HOUSING

Enjoy the full college experience – live on campus!

Kennesaw State University offers three residential living-learning communities: the University Village, University Place, and KSU Place. All first-time new traditional aged residential students will live at the University Village, housing 750 students in 2, 3, and 4 bedroom units. An additional 700 spaces are available at University Place and 550 spaces at KSU Place for returning and new students. All apartments have private bedrooms with cable and Internet access, and are fully furnished and carpeted with full kitchens. All apartments at University Village and University Place have private bathrooms and a washer and dryer. There is also plenty of parking right near the residence halls reserved for on-campus students. ADMISSIONS

It is the responsibility of the applicant to review the admission standards before applying to understand the likelihood of eligibility. Undergraduate standards may be found at www.kennesaw.edu/admissions. Regardless of application type, all official transcripts, application fee, test scores and documents must be received by posted deadlines for the semester of interest. The application processing fee is non-refundable. While appointments are suggested, you are invited to attend one of the weekly INSIGHT sessions held every Tuesday or Thursday afternoon at 3:45 p.m. Visiting hours are Monday – Friday 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. The Office of Admissions is located in Kennesaw Hall. (Admission standards are subject to change.)

FINANCIAL AID

Financing college today can be a challenge, but it does not have to be impossible. We will work with you to create a financial aid package that will allow you to attend KSU.

Over 60% of our currently enrolled students receive some form of financial assistance. More than \$30,000,000 of scholarships, grants, loans or work-study is awarded annually to assist students in reaching their educational goals.

TUITION AND FEES

Kennesaw State is one of the most affordable public institutions in the state of Georgia. Undergraduate tuition and fees for 2004/05 for a full time in-state student is approximately \$1400.00 per term; \$4,800.00 for full time out-of-state students. Books average \$300.00 per term depending on the number of courses taken. On-campus apartments are available and monthly rent varies. (Fees are subject to change.)
